## Words From Our Community Lay Director

A new year is upon us and with it comes the refreshing sense of a new beginning, a fresh start. God will undoubtedly offer new opportunities for us, as born again believers, to carry out this scripture from Psalm 96. What is it that is so pressing in our lives that we repeatedly fail to recognize the obvious blessings God gives us **on a daily basis** and neglect to come out of our own worlds **on a daily basis** to proclaim His love and salvation to others? What is it that causes us to fall in stride with the rest of the world?

Could the answer be busyness? Our crafty opponent has us convinced that we must join more committees at church, sign up our children for more activities so they will have a well rounded life, and give more of ourselves at work so that we can afford all the things that “everyone has”. We've fallen into this trap,

and in the process of going more places and being around more people, ironically, we've become more disconnected. We've trained ourselves to walk in a store and look right through people when we pass them, with no acknowledgement of our fellow human beings. Our plan is to quickly get in and get out so we can go about our day and complete all of our tasks. God's plan may be decisively different. However, how will we know? How will we recognize our opportunities to serve Him? – You know, the opportunities that aren't scheduled on our calendars.

As we move further into this new year, I challenge each of us to examine our **daily lives**. Are we living sacrifices for the Lord or are we having to sacrifice some of “our” time to make room for the Lord? The Lord tells us in **Psalm 46:10a** to “Be still and know that I am God”. My prayer for all of us is that we will take quiet, still time to know our God, which will in turn open our eyes to the opportunities He sets before us. Praise God, once we remove our eyes from our agendas, and allow ourselves to live each day according to His will, then we will become living sacrifices for Him.

## Words From Our Fall Weekend Lay Directors

### *Men's #29*

The leaders saw that Peter and John were not afraid to speak, and they understood that these men had no special training or education. So they were amazed. Then they realized that Peter and John had been with Jesus. -Acts 4:13

Take a group of ordinary men with no special worldly training or qualifications who answer God's invitation to join him in his work. Bathe these men in prayer and the Holy Spirit for a ten week period of spiritual preparation and training. Surround them with a Christian community to pray for them and provide for their needs.

Next, add a group of ordinary men who have answered God's invitation to spend a weekend with Him. Tell them little or nothing about what they have committed to for that weekend, but allow them to simply trust. Ask them to leave behind all ties to their lives outside the weekend—to “let go, let God.”

These are the ingredients for the Walk to Emmaus weekend, and for the Men's #29 the Master Chef cooked up an extraordinary banquet.

Ordinary men, complete with baggage including health concerns, grief, emotional scars, employment uncertainties and all the other concerns of the world, came together in the name of Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. They came together to be served and to serve, to be loved and to love, and to worship our Lord as one. None of us, Pilgrims and team alike, knew everything God had in store; we simply came.

And of course, God was there waiting for us. Together we experienced the love of Jesus delivered by His many servants in the Emmaus community. Together we witnessed healing and restoration. Together we truly felt His awesome presence.

At the fourth day gathering, as we shared our experiences since the weekend, one thing became apparent: none of us was the same. God had indeed done an extraordinary thing with a group of ordinary men—men who had been with Jesus!

## **Chrysalis News**

As I sit here contemplating what to share with the Chesapeake Community regarding your Chrysalis Butterflies, so many ideas run through my head. I think about how in Matthew 28:19 Jesus gives us the Great Commission when he said, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations." Have we as a community set our sites on doing just that? While Emmaus weekends are structured so as to develop and strengthen Christian leaders within our churches, are we as a community looking at the youth within our churches and seeing leadership qualities in them? Are we encouraging the

youth in our lives, in our schools, in our churches, to grow in their relationship with Christ? Do we see them as our future Pastors, laity, Sunday school teachers, sharing the word of God with others. I pray you do! However, if that is the case then my concern is we are still missing opportunities to help those youth Fly With Christ! Sadly enough we plan for 25 caterpillars per weekend to take their flights but we average around 12 youth per weekend, and have yet to have a full weekend. If you know someone between the age of 15 and 18 who is looking to grow in their faith they would be wonderful candidates for Chrysalis. However, we as a Chrysalis Board also recognize the difficulty sponsors sometimes have in placing 19 – 24 year olds on an Emmaus weekend, even though they may be considered age appropriate. The Upper Room not only offers Emmaus and Chrysalis weekends... "Journeys", weekends just like Emmaus and Chrysalis, are often held on college campuses. Although we are currently unable to provide a separate Journey weekend, we are able to include this age group on a Chrysalis weekend. We do this by allowing them to participate as other Chrysalis youth, providing a table specifically for Journey age (19-24 and single) candidates, along with an adult and older youth table leader. So you see the age span is increased and we would love nothing more than to see the number of candidates to follow suite. God is calling each of us to look around, is there children of yours, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, friends, or neighbors children who would benefit from this experience. There are so many youth looking for answers, give them the opportunity of a life time to truly experience Christ! Allow them the chance to Fly With Christ!

Please keep the youth in prayer, we need and welcome your support in all areas.....letters, table agape, candlelight, closing.....
